whilst education has been widely recognised as a key tool for development this has tended to be limited to the incremental changes that education can bring about within a given development paradigm as opposed to its role in challenging dominant conceptions and practices of development and creating alternatives through a collection of insightful and provocative chapters this book will examine the role of learning in shaping new discourses and practices of development by drawing on contributions from activists researchers education and development practitioners from around the world this book situates

learning within the wider political and cultural economies of development it critically explores if and how learning can shape processes of societal transformation and consequently a new language and practice of development this includes offering critical accounts of popular informal and non formal learning processes as well as the contribution of indigenous knowledges in providing spaces for the co production of knowledge thinking and action on development and in terms of shaping the ways in which citizens engage with and create new understandings of development itself this book makes an important and original contribution by reframing educational practices and processes in relation to broader global struggles for justice voice and development in a rapidly changing development landscape

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traditionally development has been rooted in ideologies and assumptions prevalent in the developed world and in practices and strategies adopted by leading industrial nations however historically eclectic ideas and approaches often clash with existing long established notions of progress and modes of realizing social and economic change managing development in a globalized world concepts processes institutions explores this topic by incorporating ideas and interpretations that have previously been neglected or given inadequate attention in the discourse on developing countries it underscores development as a continuous process that must be supported by sound policies and efficient management supplying a wider understanding of the field the authors argue that the application of innovative development techniques and best practices is essential for obtaining optimum results in meeting the needs of society they examine the style of managing development with a new perspective that links the phenomenon with changing demands and the interplay of internal external actors and a host of stakeholders an exploration of key sectors in development provides clear comprehension of problems and solutions a careful synthesis of theoretical conceptual and empirical literature the book assesses real world situations and provides insight into the

operational dynamics of development policies programs and institutions it focuses on goals values and dynamics of development management that are undergoing rapid changes and continue to be enhanced to alleviate poverty and improve living standards in an era of globalization and inter regional and inter institutional synergies it highlights best practices essential for the efficient and effective delivery of human development services that are designed and put in place to obtain optimum results in meeting the needs of society

moving the youth development message turning a vague idea into a moral imperative peter l benson and karen pittman the contagion of an idea in the past fifteen years countless programs agencies funding initiatives professionals and volunteers have embraced the term youth development linked more by shared passion than by formal membership or credentials these people and places have contributed to a wave of energy and activity not unlike that of a social movement with a multitude of people on the ground connecting to a set of ideas that give sustenance support and value to increasingly innovative efforts to build competent successful and healthy youth there are several particularly interesting dimensions to this movement first the youth development idea has the potential to draw people and organizations together across many sectors conferences and initiatives using youth development language attract increasingly eclectic audiences bringing together national youth organizations schools city county and state agencies police and juvenile justice workers clergy and committed citizens perhaps embedded in the youth development idea is a philosophy or a way that has created an intellectual and or spiritual home for actors across many settings however this happens it is clear that one of the powerful social consequences of the youth development idea is a connecting of the dots the weaving within and across city county state and of a tapestry of new relationships

over the past 20 years the field of information systems has grown dramatically in theoretical diversity and global reach this growth is reflected in the language that policy makers and organizational stakeholders use when they talk about their plans as information technology penetrates further into organizational and global life it becomes ever more important to articulate

assumptions embedded in the discourse this will help to clarify the complex and yet conceptually improvised or pasted up worldview that becomes embodied in systems the assumptions point to particular domains of discourse the discourse sets up conventions and boundaries it thus shapes what can or cannot legitimately be talked about researched addressed or solved within the scope of it a number of practical and theoretical topics are discussed in detail including globalization development and space mobilization of power erp systems is planning and projects critical research and the study of discourse public institutions analytical frameworks this book contains the selected proceedings of the working conference on global and organizational discourse about information technology sponsored by the international federation for information processing ifip and held in barcelona spain in december 2002

china s rise as an aid provider in africa has caught global attention with china s activity being viewed as the projection of soft power of a neo colonialist kind in an international relations context this book which focuses on china s education aid government scholarships training confucius institutes dispatched teachers etc reveals a much more complicated picture it outlines how the divide between the chinese ministry of commerce and the ministry of education hinders china s soft power projection how much of china s aid is bound up with an education for economic growth outlook mirroring china s own recent experiences of economic development and how china s aid prioritized to reflect the commercial sector s interests is out of step with most international development aid which is dominated by education agendas and the campaigns of international organizations and traditional donors this leaves china easily exposed to the charge of neo colonialism this situation also reveals insufficient knowledge production of china and in south south cooperation substantial production of southern knowledge should recognize the international development cooperation architecture as an open system by which both traditional donors and southern countries transform

over the past decade there has been an increasingly receptive audience for participatory and qualitative research methods by policy makers development practitioners and academics working in applied research at the same time there is an increasing

awareness that the value of research can be enhanced through a more systematic combination of quantitative and qualitative methods while this recent interest has begun to provide useful pointers as to how development research might be improved it has also given rise to certain problems this book will draw together lessons about emerging best practice with regard to combining qualitative and quantitative methods and approaches to generate numbers from qualitative participatory methods and to monitor and evaluate development processes it will build and expand upon innovation and reflection from practice in developing and developed societies from within development agencies and academia government departments and civil society organizations by drawing on current research in many sectors and countries the book will situate current development research issues squarely within debates about development policy and social research and it will help begin the process of defining best practice in the use of participatory qualitative and quantitative methods and issues of methodological triangulation which are of considerable interest to academics practitioners and policy makers a genuine how to manual which combines best practice and new innovations and presents fascinating material for academics practitioners and policy makers
